It has been a wonderful week at Las Vegas, for Momentum # EMC World 2016! We've seen a lot of our customers moving to Documentum REST Services and seen more customers gaining interests in the REST paradigm. Let's take a review of what has happened in the week.

On Tuesday, Jonathan Robie, Simon O'Brien, Ahmed AbdelSamad and me had an introduction session for "***The REST Portfolio: A Developer's Perspective***". The session contains three chapters, each with around 20 minutes:

- An overview and demo of REST APIs in Documentum product suites
- Services, extensibility and demo for Documentum Core REST Services, from the initial release 7.0 to the coming release 7.3 (bedrock)
- A great example and demo of Capital Projects solution for Documentum, which evolves from webtop extension to cloud first web application by using Documentum Core REST Services extensibility
